**A WELL-KNOWN CITIZEN DROWNED.—**  
Yesterday morning, about eleven o'clock, the body of Mr. HARRY CONNELLY, a well-known liquor merchant, was found drowned in the Delaware river at Christian street wharf. The circumstances connected with his death are not reliably known. On Monday evening he was in company with a number of friends, and left them between ten and eleven o'clock, with the ostensible purpose of proceeding to his residence, Walnut street, near Twentieth. Since that time his whereabouts are veiled in mystery, until the discovery of his body at the above mentioned locality. Mr. CONNELLY was well known in political circles, was formerly connected with the Sunbury and Erie Railroad Company, and was a Trustee of the Philadelphia Gas Works and attached to various other public institutions. He was about fifty years old at the time of his decease.
