New Orleans September 25. 1851

My dear Uncle,

to you before. Believe me dear uncle it might have been through neglect

to Papa on my account, & for my well being, I have not yet learnt dear
to be cold heart, I hope I never may be so, I have not forgotten the instructions
of my parents. I had a letter the other day from Papa in which he
wrote of his having been to see the Great Exhibition Exhibition
with Adey & Frank & that they had enjoyed themselves very much;
gives some unpleasant news fromamma. I suppose you heard that
Papa's case came on before the Judicial Committee of the Privy
Council, June the 28. I send you the Times Newspaper in which
it all contained. & which I no doubt you would like to see.
Dear, Dear uncle, I beg you will forgive me & in future I promise
to write & also to answer your letters as soon as possible.
